

ALDERSGATE DAY

On Wednesday, May 24, 1738, the Reverend John Wesley, a priest in the Church of England, experienced his "heart strangely warmed," as he wrote in his journal. Wesley's awakening to salvation by grace through faith happened on Aldersgate Street in London, England. It was crucial for his own life and became a touchstone for the Wesleyan movement that is the origin of today's United Methodist Church.

MEMORIAL DAY

Observed the last Monday in May, Memorial Day honors the war dead of the United States of America. It was first celebrated on May 5, 1866 in Waterloo, New York in the aftermath of the American Civil War. It was originally called Decoration Day from the practice of decorating the graves of the war's fallen soldiers with flowers and flags. In 1950, Congress passed a resolution requesting that the president issue a proclamation calling Americans to observe Memorial Day as a day of Prayer for Permanent Peace. In 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, establishing Memorial Day as the last Monday in May. It became an official holiday in 1971.

NATIONAL EMS WEEK

National Emergency Medical Service (EMS) week was May 18 through today, May 25. It recognizes and celebrates EMS first responders for their commitment and dedication to the community and those they service.
