CHRISTMAS CARDS FOR HOPE

In Christ, God shows us that we can trust in the power of God to shine through us so that we might shine the light of God's hope on the injustice and suffering all around us in this world.

FACT: 1 in 7 residents of Connecticut struggle with hunger. 1 in 6 are children. This represents a 40% increase since 2020 and continues to grow. Even in a state as wealthy as Connecticut, there is need for food assistance in every community. Sometimes the difference between a family that uses a food program and one that doesn't is

the sudden loss of a job, an illness or the unexpected rise in healthcare or utility expenses. (Source: CT FoodShare)

Locally, the Community Services Council of Woodbury (CSCW) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to assisting Woodbury residents facing financial challenges. Founded over three decades ago by local faith communities, CSCW has grown into a vital resource for our town, offering compassionate support to individuals and families in need.

CSCW operates several key programs to support our community:

- Woodbury Food Bank: Serving an average of 80 families weekly, the Food Bank provides essential groceries to households in need. Additionally, the food bank offers donated items not typically stocked, allowing guests to choose freely.
- **Energy Assistance**: During colder months, CSCW provides supplementary heating assistance to help families manage rising energy costs.
- **Crisis Assistance**: In times of sudden hardship—such as job loss, illness, or personal tragedy—CSCW offers short-term financial aid to help individuals regain stability.
