#### **Christmas Cards for Peace**

As we look around the world, we see violent conflict that causes hunger, migration, and destruction of infrastructure – leaving people without hope. This Advent, we wait for the coming of the Prince of Peace so that the world might be reconciled, and peace might prevail. A peace that is anchored in justice and mercy. A peace that shows compassion for those whose lives are disrupted, whose bodies are broken, and whose voices are so often drowned out. 


